CN TOWER

CN Tower or Canadian National is the tenth tallest free-standing structure in the world. Its height is 553 metres; this equals about 100 stories with 1,776 steps!



Casa Loma is a Gothic, castle-style mansion that is now a historic house museum and landmark. It was finished in 1914 as a residence for Sir Henry Pellatt. Almost 100 movies have been filmed at Casa Loma including the X-Men movie in 2000.



TORONTO ZOO

The Toronto Zoo is the largest zoo in Canada. It has one of the most diverse collections of animals and is currently home to 5000 animals.



The Ontario Science Centre is one of the first interactive science museums in the world. Visitors can learn through play and discover ways to think like a scientist every day.



ROYAL ONTARIO MUSEUM

The ROM is Canada's largest and busiest museums with over a million visitors yearly. It houses a collection of 13 million artworks, cultural objects and natural history specimens.



The famous Niagara Falls spans the province of Ontario in Canada and the state of New York in the U.S. The combined falls have the highest flow rate of any waterfall in North America with a vertical drop of 50 m or 160 ft.

Ottawa

Canada's capital city, Ottawa, is the perfect place to experience some of the country's best attractions, celebrations and flavours in one welcoming city. Ottawa has a unique blend of urban and rural beauty, year-round outdoor activities, and vibrant neighbourhoods.



Montreal

Montreal is the second-most populous city in Canada and the most populous city in the Canadian province of Quebec. French is the city's official language and 85% of its residents consider themselves fluent. Montreal is one of the most bilingual cities in Canada where more than half the population speak English and French.



Quebec City

Quebec City is the capital city of the Canadian province of Quebec. Quebec was added to UNESCO's World Heritage List; its "Old City" is a great example of a fortified colonial town and the only city in North America whose fortifications are virtually all intact. Quebec is where French civilization began in North America and it has remained home to a francophone culture since the 17th century.



Kingston - Thousand Island Cruise

Midway between Toronto and Montreal lies the city of Kingston. Once named the capital of Canada from 1841 to 1844, Kingston has a long and storied French and British history. Kingston is the start of the "Thousand Island" cruise; 1,864 islands straddle the Canada-US border from eastern Lake Ontario to the St. Lawrence River. Interestingly, these same islands give name to the famous "Thousand Island" salad dressing!
